

Purpose: Train and Provide Assistance Dogs Free of Charge to People with Disabilities











Service Dogs assist adults with physical disabilities by enhancing their ability to perform practical daily tasks such as retrieving dropped items, opening doors, and turning on and off light switches.

Hearing Dogs benefit adults who are deaf or hard of hearing by alerting them to important everyday sounds such as an alarm clock, a doorbell, or the cry of a baby.

Skilled Companion Dogs help children and adults with physical and/or developmental disabilities by performing many of the functions of the service dog. The team is facilitated by a family member or caregiver. They are equally valued for the role they play in providing their partners with a social bridge to others.

Facility Dogs work at the side of a professional in such fields as physical and occupational therapy, special education, criminal justice, and hospice care. Facility dogs engage patients in activities to stimulate healing and recovery, provide comfort and unconditional love, and serve in teaching programs for students with special needs.
